NOTE: All Livestock entries are to be received by mail or delivered to the Secretary by August 31st. They must be completed in full and be accompanied by payment of all Entry and Class fees. (Incomplete forms will not be processed pending receipt of payment). You are required to provide proof of Insurance, Copy of Registration Certificates and have Waiver Forms properly signed.

ATTENTION: As soon as livestock is in the barn please proceed to Westfield Gate Office to Register your entry and receive bracelets and passes. It will be open at 12 noon for your convenience. The Office at the Light Horse Barn will be open from 3 pm to 9 pm to register light horse entries.

The Light Horse Office will be open Monday, Sept 18th, 2017 from 3 pm to 9 pm to Register your entry and pick up bracelets, passes and back #'s. Early arrivals can complete their registration at the Westfield Gate at 12 noon prior to the above posted time.

PLEASE NOTE: All entries must be received with payment of entry in full by August 31st, 2017 or they will be subject to post entry fees. Campers will not be parked by the attendants without a paid receipt. Whether paying in advance or on arrival all receipts will be available at the Westfield Gate before proceeding to camping area.

OPEN SHOW ALL WEEK LONG

Anyone choosing to Day Show must enter at the Co-Op Road Gate and proceed to the Show Ring office to register. Horses and Ponies that are showing for the entire week and require stabling must be on the grounds and registered by 10 pm Monday, September 18th, 2017 and must stay until 9 pm, Saturday, September 23rd, 2017.

We will not guarantee stall space for day showing.

Box Stalls are limited in number and preference will be given to Stallions and Mares with foals.

PROOF OF INSURANCE MUST ACCOMPANY ENTRY FORM AND WAIVER MUST BE SIGNED CLOSING DATE FOR ENTRIES IS AUGUST 31, 2017

Entries that are paid in full will be processed in the order in which they are received-others held pending available space.

Do not send Box Stall Fees with your entry form. If you get a Box Stall it must be paid for upon arrival at the Fair Grounds. Please include a note with your entry form as to why a Box Stall is required. This will eliminate refund of fees.

All Exhibitor Passes will be passed out at time of Registration. **Regular Season Passes and Parking Passes are not to be prepaid. They will be available on Sunday and Monday at the Westfield Gate office along with Camping receipts and Exhibitor registration.**

We will be giving out High Point Awards this year. Every Exhibitor will be given a ballot to vote for Best Sportsmanship in their own age category.

17. Entry Forms with Fees paid in full must be received by August 31st, 2017. After the closing date all Class Fees will be subject to Post Entry Fees. No Box Stall Fees are to be included with Entry. There will definitely be no switching of Classes on Entry Form to another Class. Errors made on Entry form, for example, entering classes for which not eligible, will be changed at Registration-any classes not listed at that time will be subject to Post Entry fees.

18. Entry and Class Fees will not be refunded unless a Veterinary Certificate is provided.

20. Exhibitors MUST notify the Light Horse Office prior to start of Class if they are scratching from Class.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR LIGHT HORSE AND PONY CLASSES

1. This is a non-sanctioned show, however it follows set rules and regulations.
2. In cases where there is some question concerning rules governing a particular class, the Judge's ruling will be final.
3. Anyone 18 years of age and under as of September 1st of the current year must wear protective headgear with an attached harness while mounted anywhere on grounds.
4. Use of helmets by riders 19 years of age and over is optional (unless otherwise stated) but it is recommended for these riders in all timed events.
5. No stallions are permitted in any Youth, Pee Wee or Pony Class.

6. Height of Horses – 14.2 hands and over, Ponies – under 14.2 hands.
7. Horse's age shall be calculated as of January 1st of current year.
8. Horses 5 years of age and under can be ridden with 2 hands on the reins and a snaffle bit without shanks or bosal in any class. All other horses entered in Open Western Classes (excluding Gymkhana) are to be ridden with one hand on the reins and only one finger between the reins, unless otherwise stated.
9. Age of rider shall be determined by Riders age as of September 1st of the current year.
10. Back number must be visible at all times. If you choose to place number on saddle pad it must be on both sides of the saddle pad. Riders will receive a warning for the first offence about incorrect back numbers or not wearing a back number, after that it may result in elimination for that class.
11. Timed Events- Any Rider crossing the start line without a hat or helmet in place will be eliminated. Deliberately tipping off hat or helmet after crossing start line will not be tolerated. First time you will receive a warning, second time will result in elimination.
12. Western Classes (Gymkhana and Performance) horses to be shown in western tack and handler or rider to be in western attire which consists of long sleeve shirt, long pants, western boots and western hat or helmet.
13. No martingales, tie downs, nosebands, draw reins, mechanical hackamores, crops, splint boots or bandages allowed in any Western Pleasure, Trail, Equitation, Command Class
14. In classes where a crop is allowed maximum length will be 75 cm.
15. Fall of horse and/or rider in any Gymkhana class or race results in elimination.
16. Entries will be processed in the order in which they are received.
17. Exhibitor Entry Fee and Class Fees must accompany entry form or they will be subject to post entry fees, unless otherwise stated. No Box stall fees are to be included with the Entry. There will not be any switching of entries from one class to another.
18. Class Fees and Entry Fees will not be refunded unless a Veterinary Certificate is provided.
19. Show will retain 20% of Class Entry Fee for Stake and Jackpot classes. Remainder will be paid out in Prize Money.
20. Exhibitors MUST notify the Light Horse Office prior to start of Class if they are scratching from Class
21. BIT RULE: At the discretion of the Judge and Ring Master, bits may be checked in any class and any bit that is either illegal or inhumane will not be allowed.
22. Flat classes which have both horses and ponies entered – at the Judge's discretion may ask the horses to lope or canter separately from the ponies.
23. Horses and ponies must be under control at all times – any entry felt not to be in control may be asked to leave the ring at the Judge's discretion.
24. Show officials reserve the right to change the program or classes if deemed necessary.
25. The rules and regulations of this show are automatically agreed to by the Exhibitor when signing their entry form.
26. Any form of cruelty, for example, excessive use of crop, spurring, kicking or hitting the horse with reins or any other object will not be tolerate and may result in disqualification. First offence will be a warning, second offence disqualification from the class, third offence will be disqualification for the week.

Exhibitors will be given a ballot to vote for the Best Sport in their own division.

GENERAL LIVESTOCK REGULATIONS

1. Horses, cattle and other livestock will be received on Monday until 9 pm. Unavoidable delays will be dealt with at the discretion of the appropriate committee.
2. The Fairgrounds will be open to the public Tuesday through Saturday – 8 am to 11 pm.
3. Judges of Livestock will meet at the Manager's Office on Tuesday to pick up books and proceed to judge classes as scheduled. On completing their judging these books are to be signed and returned to the Manager's office by the Clerks.
4. No cattle of any breed under 3 months of age shall be allowed to compete for prizes.
5. Pedigrees of all purebred animals over one year of age shall be shown at the time of judging. For purebred animals under one year of age the name and number of sire and dame shall be submitted in writing at the time of judging. Grade animals are the progeny of a purebred sire.
6. Animals low in flesh or otherwise inferior character, unworthy of a place in exhibition, will not be admitted under any circumstances.
7. Any animal exhibiting signs of unsoundness or lameness may be excused from the ring at the Judge's discretion.
8. All livestock entries shall be received by the date as shown in the prize books, on forms which are supplied by the Fair and are required to be completed with contact information and registration for livestock and all class entries.
9. Safety of Exhibits: though the Association will take reasonable precaution to insure the safety of articles sent or brought to the exhibition, yet it must be definitely understood that the owner themselves must assume all risk. Should any article be accidentally injured, lost or stolen the association will give all the assistance in its power toward recovery.
10. All livestock must be shown in the ring unless otherwise specified. In estimating the value of livestock the judge will take into consideration where animals of different ages are competing against each other.
11. No animal or article can compete in more than one class or in more than one section of the same class except as a herd.
12. No reward or money prize not offered in the list will be paid except it be highly recommended by the Judge and Committee.
13. It does not follow that because a prize is offered for any particular animal or article, that it must be awarded unless there is proper competition or unless the exhibit is of sufficient merit to warrant the award being made.
14. Exhibitors can ascertain from the Superintendent in charge of several departments, when the judge will examine their exhibits. No complaint based upon the statement that Judges overlook animals or articles will therefore be entertained by the executives.
15. Livestock for competition or exhibit shall not be removed from the grounds before 9 pm the closing day of the Exhibition.
16. Exhibitors must supply proper fastenings for safely securing the animals in stalls. The Committee will not be responsible for any injury or accident to any animal during the time of the Exhibition or on the Exhibition grounds.
17. Five members of the general committee shall form a quorum for the transaction of business.
18. Any Exhibitor infringing any of the regulations shall forfeit all or any of the prizes that may have been awarded to him.
19. Prize Colors: 1st – Red 2nd - Blue 3rd - White 4th - Green

20. No person shall be allowed to interfere with the Judges while in the discharge of their duties. Exhibitors so interfering will forfeit their right to any premium to which they might
21. Prize money not to be paid out immediately following the class will be paid during the two week period following the closing of the fair, by cheque, through the mail. These cheques are to be cashed by the end of November. Exhibitors are urged to have their prize accounts checked at the fair office the day following the close of the Fair.
22. All hauling contests will be judged on a percentage basis unless otherwise stated.
23. Try as we may, we cannot always avoid mistakes, but we can and will cheerfully correct them. Please call our attention to our mistakes.
