QUEENS COUNTY FAIR - MAIN BUILDING - GENERAL REGULATIONS

1. PLEASE NOTE CHANGES TO ENTRY DAYS AND TIMES AS THEY WILL AFFECT WHEN JUDGING TAKES PLACE

- 2. The Fair grounds will open to the public Tuesday through Saturday from 8 am to 11 pm daily.
- 3. Judges for the Main Building will arrive as scheduled to receive the Judge's Books and supplies, then proceed to award prizes. On completing the judging, etc. they will sign the books and return them to the Main Building Committee.
- 4. All articles for competition, except livestock, must be the production or manufacture of the Exhibitor and made in the current year.
- 5. No person shall be allowed to enter for competition more than 1 specimen or required quantity of any one section. This does not apply to livestock.
- 6. Safety of Exhibits. The Association will take reasonable precaution to insure the safety of all articles on display but all Exhibitors do so at their own risk. Should any article be damaged, lost or stolen the association will do everything in its power to recover the same but is under no financial obligation for the value of the item.
- 7. On the entry of each article a card will be furnished to the exhibitor on which is specified the class, section and exhibitor number. This card is to be attached to the article during exhibition. All entries must also be recorded on the Exhibitor sheet received with the entry cards, personal contact information required and returned to the Committee once completed.
- 8. Prize Money and awards not offered in the prize list or previously authorized by the Committee will be paid except it be highly recommended by the Judges.
- 9. All prizes are awarded with a view to a standard of excellence and prizes for Best Exhibits means for excellence, design, amount of work, etc. is of secondary importance. No entry shall be given a prize because it is the only entry in the class. Therefore, it follows that just because a particular prize is offered it does not have to be awarded unless there is proper competition or unless the exhibit is of sufficient merit to warrant the award being made.
- 10. Exhibitors can ascertain from Main Building Book or Main Office, when the judges will examine their exhibits. No complaint based on the statement that Judges overlook animals or articles will, therefore be entered by the executive.
- 11. Articles in competition in the Main Building shall not be removed before 10 am. On Sunday, at which time staff will be available to confirm prizes awarded and pay out prize monies.
- 12. The Main building Committee and executive shall form a quorum for the transaction of business.
- 13. Prize Colors: 1st Red, 2nd Blue, 3rd White, 4th Green
- 14. Any Exhibitor infringing any of these regulations or any person interfering with the judges in the discharge of their duties shall forfeit all or any of the prizes that may have been awarded to them.
- 15. All entries of preserves, canning and pickles will be opened for judging.
- 16. Mistakes will cheerfully be corrected, please bring them to our attention.

- 2. Exhibitors may enter as many classes or section of a class as they wish, but no Exhibitor shall make more than one entry in a single section of class either in his own name, the name of the Company, a farm or the name of another person.
- 3. No trees may be exhibited that have been sprayed with or have artificial color or chemicals added in any manner.
- 4. Trees exhibited will remain the property of the Exhibition and may be picked up after the Exhibition has closed.
- 5. Trees must be delivered to the Exhibition grounds before 10 pm Monday, prior to opening day or they will not be eligible. Trees arriving earlier will be readied for judging which will begin on Tuesday.
- 6. No prizes will be awarded in any class or section of a class unless the exhibits are worthy. The Judge reserves the right to eliminate any tree that is unqualified.
- 7. Trees to be exhibited shall be within the following classes with all height measurements being made from the bottom of the butt to the top of the tip with a standard butt length of not more than 12 inches.
